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## EMERGENCY CHECKLIST - 12 Man Overboard

A.	Action	Personnel responsible	<i>Completed</i>
1.	Turn on side that man fell overboard.	Officer On Duty	
2.	Stop engines.	Officer On Duty	
3.	Assign the look-out to indicate the position of the person in the water.	Master	
4.	Release lifebuoy with light & smoke signal on side that man fell overboard.	Officer On Duty	
5.	Activate GNSS MOB marker.	Officer On Duty	
6.	Mark MOB position on ECDIS.	Officer On Duty	
7.	Plot vessel's position with respect to man.	Officer On Duty	
8.	Plot lifebuoy position.	Officer On Duty	
9.	Engage hand steering.	Officer On Duty	
10.	Commence Williamson turn.	Officer On Duty	
11.	Sound alarm, including three prolonged blasts on ship's whistle.	Officer On Duty	
12.	Post lookout with binoculars.	Officer On Duty	
13.	Call Master.	Officer On Duty	
14.	Place engines on stand by advising engine room the reason.	Officer On Duty	
15.	Muster accident boat crew.	Master/ Ch. Off.	
16.	Complete Williamson Turn.	Master	
17.	Alert by radio vessels in vicinity & shore stations.	Master / GMDSS Off.	
18.	Prepare for recovery of persons from the water.	Master / Ch. Officer	
19.	Broadcast DISTRESS message, if appropriate.	Master / GMDSS Off.	
20.	Engines on standby.	Master / Ch. Engineer	
21.	Assume role of On-Scene Coordinator.	Master / Ch. Officer	
22.	Hoist signal flag OSCAR.	Master / Ch. Officer	
23.	Maneuver to pick up man.	Master	
24.	Switch on VHF.	Officer On Duty	
25.	Note other vessels in the vicinity warning them as necessary by sound or light signals.	Master / Officer On Duty	
26.	Maintain log/record of events and decisions.	Master	
27.	Report to the Office.	Master
